Dr Dorota Jarosinska works at the WHO European Centre for Environment and Health in Bonn, leading a programme on Environmental Exposures and Risks, with a diverse portfolio, covering a range of health relevant environmental and occupational factors, including air pollution, chemical safety, and noise.

Trained as a medical doctor, she obtained her PhD in medicine at the Institute of Occupational Medicine and Environmental Health in Poland. A specialist in public health, she has over 24 years of experience in environmental health at national and international levels. Postgraduate training included a year-long course on Advanced Environmental Sanitation in the Netherlands, and a two-year long training in environmental health for physicians in Poland. She was a Fulbright scholar at the National Institute of Environmental Health Sciences, US.

Prior to joining WHO (in 2014), she was leading the first unit of environmental medicine at the Institute of Occupational Medicine and Environmental Health in Poland, and was involved in several technical working groups and advisory bodies in the European Commission and in the WHO Environment and Health process; for nine years worked at the European Environment Agency focusing on human health and well-being aspects. Authored several scientific papers and contributed to the reports by EEA, WHO, and UNEP. She is a Fellow of the Collegium Ramazzini.
